



Green light for Sleaford housing scheme

A scheme to build 72 much-needed affordable homes in Sleaford is due to start in March, thanks to more than £3m in funding from the Homes and Communities Agency.

Lincolnshire housing association, Acis, has announced that it will be working with construction group, Westleigh Developments, on the £9m development on Church Lane.

The homes – which are due to be completed by December next year - will be available for rent, shared ownership and intermediate market rent, where customers will be able to rent now and buy later.

“This is great news for Sleaford and the area,” said Business and Investment Director of Acis, Nev Thompson. “In this current economic climate, there is an increasing demand for affordable homes. Thanks to this extra funding from the Homes and Communities we can go some way to meeting that need locally by providing new homes for rent and for shared ownership.”

There will be a mix of flats and a combination of two, three and four bedroom homes.

This is the second grant for Acis Group from the Homes and Communities Agency (HCA) in the last two months meaning that the housing association will have received almost £7m in vital funding from the Agency.
