### **New Bardney homes officially opened by Acis**

Lincolnshire based housing association Acis Group officially opened their new homes development in the village of Bardney, east of Lincoln.

Acis, who own and manage over 5,200 homes across Lincolnshire, Nottinghamshire and South Yorkshire, declared their Norman Way development officially open on 6 October in front of residents, local dignitaries, special guests, partners and employees. Acis Chairman Rod Must addressed the assembled gathering before handing over to Councillor William Parry, Chairman of West Lindsey District Council, to cut the ribbon and declare Norman Way officially open.

Norman Way has created 19 affordable homes, with Acis appointing property developer Kier Homes to undertake the scheme's construction. It represents a total investment of over £1.8 million and was part funded by a Homes and Communities Agency grant of £600,000.

Rod Must, Chairman of Acis, said:

“Norman Way reflects our priorities of putting people first and providing better places for people to live. The development has proved to be a great success and this is another milestone in the company's history.”

The project was constructed just off Wragby Road, forming part of a wider housing development, and features a mix of two and three bedroom houses. Homes available for rent and rent to own, where customers can rent now and buy later, are included in the scheme.

Chief Executive of Acis, Valerie Waby, added:

“We are very proud as an organisation to be able to provide more new homes in Bardney. We have ensured that our new residents are able to live in high quality, affordable homes in a rural location.”

The event also marked the first formal event for Rod Must as Acis Chairman, following his appointment in October.
