Acis hands over keys to latest new homes

Lincolnshire based housing association Acis Group recently handed over the keys to their latest new homes in the town of Gainsborough.

Acis, who own and manage over 5,000 homes across Lincolnshire, Nottinghamshire and South Yorkshire, handed over the keys to new residents of their development on Riseholme Road.

The £7.5million scheme will eventually create more than 70 much needed affordable homes when complete thanks to £3million of funding from the Homes and Communities Agency and a further £4.5million of investment from Acis themselves. Acis appointed Lincolnshire-based construction group Lindum to carry out the work, which began in February 2009.

This first phase of the project saw 37 new homes handed over, featuring a mix of two and three bedroom bungalows, two, three and four bedroom houses, and two bedroom flats. Built on land belonging to Acis at Park Springs, a total of 74 new homes will be available for rent, shared ownership and intermediate market rent, where customers can rent now and buy later.

Chief Executive of Acis, Valerie Waby, said,

“Handing over the first phase of this multimillion pound investment to our new customers represents our commitment to the residents of Gainsborough and West Lindsey. We pride ourselves in putting people first and providing better places for people to live. These new homes means that we can help meet the growing demand for high quality affordable homes in this area.”
